






HOME ELECTRICAL SAFETY INSPECTION







Flipping the Switch WORD SCRAMBLE



Unscramble the letters to reveal the names of common appliances and electronics that you should turn off when not in use. Use the pictures below for clues.




The Energy Explorers want to remind you to always practice electrical safety! Remember, electricity can be dangerous, so make sure to avoid electrical hazards.

DIRECTIONS: Circle the item that doesn't belong. **HINT:** If all three items in the row were combined, which would make the situation an electrical hazard?


















- **COOPERATIVES** are local organizations and businesses, so they understand the communities they serve.

- Co-ops are led by the members they **SERVE**.

Share an energy saving tip with a loved one.	Check to ensure an electrical outlet is not overloaded. (But don't touch)	Unplug a device that is not in use.	Check for a fire extinguisher.	Take a shorter shower/bath to use less water.

Turn off the water while brushing your teeth.	Check to make sure liquids are away from electronics.	Ask if smoke detectors are working.	Tell an adult family member about a leaky faucet.	Check if any incandescent or CFL bulbs can be replaced with an LED bulb.
